COPYRIGHT ACT AMENDMENT

Hon. FERNAND RINFRET (Secretary of State) moved for leave to introduce Bill No. 37, to amend the Copyright Act.

Mr. STEVENS: Explain.

Mr. RINFRET: This bill proposes to amend the act in two particulars. One new clause will define the moral right of the author

to the title and contents of his work, even though he has assigned the copyright and ownership of such work.

Another clause deals with section 40 of the statute which covers registration, and some changes are proposed.

Motion agreed to and bill read the first time.

NATURAL RESOURCES

AGREEMENT WITH BRITISH COLUMBIA

Hon. CHARLES STEWART (Minister of the Interior) moved that the house go into committee to-morrow to consider the following proposed resolution:

That it is expedient to bring in a measure to confirm the agreement between the governments of the Dominion and the province of British Columbia, dated the 20th day of February, 1930, respecting the transfer of the lands in the railway belt and the Peace River block in the province of British Columbia.

He said: His Excellency the Governor General, having been made acquainted with the subject matter of this resolution, recommends it to the favourable consideration of the house.

Motion agreed to.

Mr. STEVENS: Mr. Speaker, will the Minister of the Interior (Mr. Stewart) inform the house if the agreement between the province of British Columbia and the government of Canada will be laid on the table before the resolution in reference thereto is discussed?

Mr. STEWART (Edmonton): The agreement has been already laid on the table.

MILITIA PENSION ACT AMENDMENT

PENSIONS TO WIDOWS OF OFFICERS

Hon. JAMES MALCOLM (Minister of Trade and Commerce, for Mr. Ralston) moved that the house go into committee to-morrow to consider the following proposed resolution:

That it is expedient to amend the Militia Pension Act to provide that pension may be granted to the widow of any officer who, at the time of his death being on full pay, dies after a period at which a pension might be granted to him, or who was at the time of his death in receipt of a pension.

He said: His Excellency the Governor General, having been made acquainted with the subject matter of this resolution, recommends it to the favourable consideration of the house.

Motion agreed to.
